S Y N O P S I S

A chronicle of childhood and identity for a young, Filipino mestizo boy who longs for a father figure while navigating the adversities of being bullied at school in 1985.

Milo is a shy, introverted boy, being raised in a single parent home by his caring, Filipino mother Lorena. His quiet nature labels him an outsider and an easy target as he's constantly teased and bullied for the way he looks.

With no father figure and a mother working to provide, Milo has little guidance in life when dealing with the hardships of his youth. There is no counsel when Dwayne and his rough neck crew surround and heckle Milo, ruffing him up and stealing his hacky sack. Milo takes matters into his own hands and resorts to concealing his brown skin under a layer of baby powder hoping for respite but Dwayne and his cronies persist.

Milo is not completely alone though. He's friends with Matt a popular kid from school, with boy next door looks, who Milo often trades comic books with. One day after school, as the boys walk down the street Milo spots a mysterious man standing at the front door of his house. The boys walk down the driveway avoiding the man but Milo is compelled to stop as he locks eyes with the stranger. Time seems to stand still. The sound of the oak tree leaves rustling in the wind resonates. The moment lingers leaving a deep impression, even though not a word is spoken between the two of them. Matt calls out to Milo breaking him out of his daze.

Completely unaware of the events from earlier in the day, that evening at the dinner table, Lorena attempts to break the ice with Milo about his father. She tells him that his father "Loves him very much" which catches Milo off guard. Confused, angered and unprepared for his mothers endeavor Milo storms off to his room. Milo's stares at an old distorted picture of his mom and dad which he keeps hidden in his comic books. The man that was at the front door bares an uncanny resemblance to the man in the picture.

Walking across the school football field, Milo spots Dwayne and his knucklehead crew kicking around the hacky sack they stole from him. Donny inadvertently kicks it out of play towards Milo's feet. Milo picks it up only to come face to face with Dwayne. This time Dwayne doesn't hold back and cracks a series of blows on Milo's face. Milo's deep, still waters stir and eventually boil-over.

D I R E C T O R S B I O

Hi, I'm Marcos Durian, I'm a Filipino-American filmmaker. I serve primarily as a cinematographer on a diverse body of work including indie feature films, commercials, short films, television movies and music videos. I got my start as a stills photography assistant and a PA on commercial productions. I moved to London, England to expand my film education through courses offered by BFI, then New York at NYFA and eventually Los Angeles where I fine-tuned my skills and learned more about the filmmaking craft working as a camera assistant with greats, like legendary photographer & commercial director Herb Ritts and directors David Fincher, Francis Lawrence, Tony K., Joe Pytko, Paul Hunter and world renowned cinematographers Darius Khondji, Paul Cameron, Sal Totino, Allen Daviau, Jeff Cutter and Pierre Rouger. These were my real teachers and I'm incredibly thankful to have had the opportunity to work and learn from them all.

Since stepping out on my own I've worked with global and regional clients including Nike, Dell Computers, Bona, The Company Store, Peter Piper Pizza, Hurley, El Torito, MTV, DKNY, Green Dot, Procter & Gamble and recording artists Gary Allen, One Republic, Lady Antebellum, Leann Rimes, Friendly Fires, Rihanna, Beck and Kelly Rowland.

Fish Head marks my first foray in the narrative directors chair and having worked in the industry for close to twenty years, telling diverse stories which reflect the Filipino-American experience has become a priority to me.

DIRECTORS STATEMENT

Fish Head is an extremely personal project, based on actual events and has been gestating and evolving for many years. It existed first as a feature length script, which I wrote back in 1998. At the time, most studios or producers had little to no interest in a Filipino-American centric coming of age story. I even had a few exec's say that if I changed the lead characters to Caucasian or African American I might have better luck. I gave it some thought, and after writing close to twenty pages, I shelved it knowing that the heart of the story was lost. Flash forward to today and diversity is on the rise. In hindsight, the reality is that if I tried to make this short film ten to fifteen years ago, I probably would never have found the incredibly talented Filipino-American cast that leads this film, namely Madison Rojas, Aina Dumlao, Cynthia San Luis and Michael Kuya.

In sharing this story, I was surprised to learn how many other people had similar experiences with using baby powder or other means to lighten their skin hoping for acceptance at school. I thought I was the only crazy kid that ever tried and failed miserably at it. My hope is that an audience will find the characters and themes explored in Fish Head relatable and that the film will both appeal and resonate with anyone that has dealt with adversities in their youth, such as being bullied, issues of identity or anyone that grew up never knowing one of their parents.

Although coming of age stories are nothing new, it's rare that we see this type of story shared through an Asian-American or specifically Filipino-American lens, which not only validates our community but sheds light on our culture, experience and record. Having worked in the industry for close to twenty years, it's always been important to me as a filmmaker to tell diverse stories that reflect not only the Filipino-American experience but also contributions... I hope this is just the beginning.

The cast and crew of Fish Head is an incredibly talented, diverse, melting pot of industry professionals. Many are women of whom numerous are FilAm or persons identifying as AAPI or URM. It was an emotional experience to be surrounded with such an amazing group of individuals! It takes a village and I have to thank my entire cast and crew for all their hard work and efforts to make Fish Head a reality. I couldn't have done it without each and every one of them and I'm extremely grateful to have had them all be a part of this project.

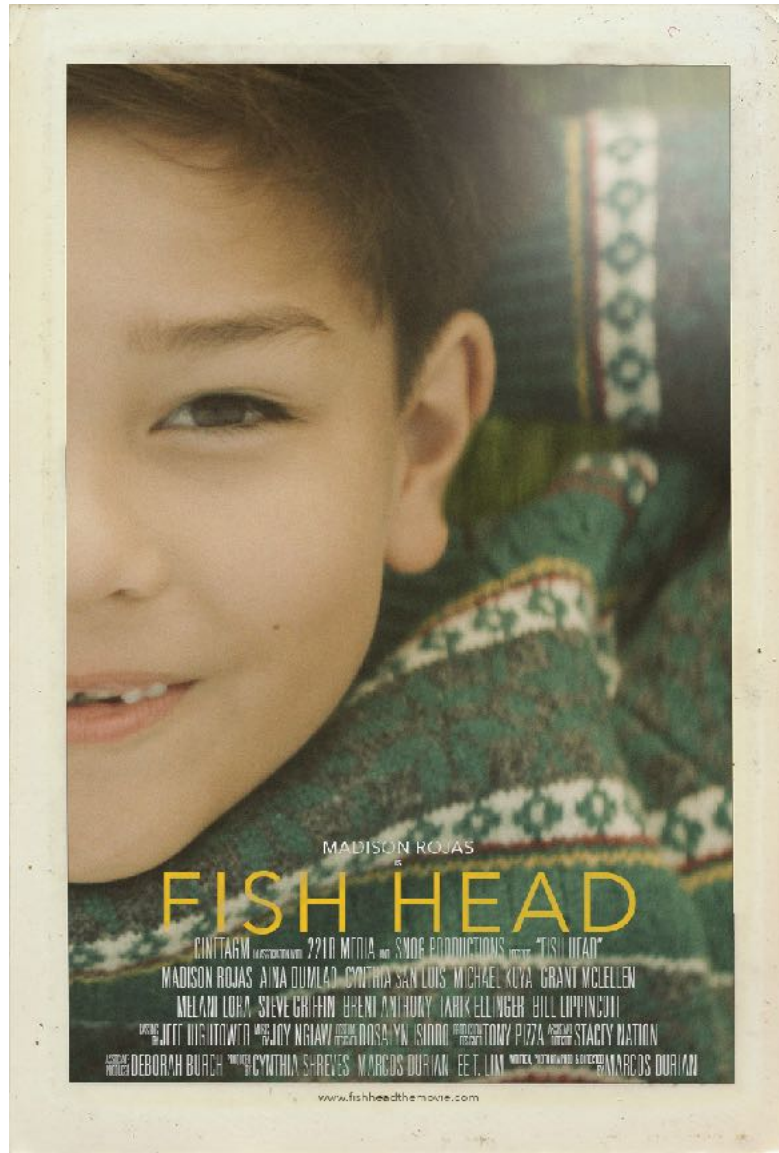
